


Small Area Population Forecasts (SAPF) 2016 based.

This summary profile was constructed using Hampshire County Council's 2016 based Small Area Population Forecasts (SAPF). The forecasts provide estimates of the population of Winchester from 2016-2023.

The Population of Winchester is forecast to increase from 121,000 to 137,100 by 2023.

Child Support Ratio (CSR)

The CSR is forecast to increase from 31.3 to 33.2 child dependents per 100 people of working age by 2023.




Elderly Support Ratio (ESR)

The ESR is forecast to increase from 34.8 to 36.9 elderly people for every 100 people of working age by 2023.





Working age and Dependent Populations (2016 to 2023)




Total Dependency Ratio (TDR)

The TDR is forecast to reach **70.1** 'dependents' per 100 people of working age by 2023 (up from **66.1** in 2016).

These forecasts suggest that in 2023 there will be 111.3 elderly people for every 100 children.




Dwellings


There is forecast to be a 14.6% increase (or 7,400 additional dwellings) by 2023, up from 50,800 dwellings in 2016.


