Cost of Living

With the cost of living still an ongoing concern, there is so much information out there to help you. Here are a list of useful websites to help.

If you are in a recognised emergency need or if you're experiencing difficulty in accessing alternative support you may be eligible for a referral to receive an emergency payment in a form of a voucher or card. Referrals are made by your Housing Officer (Income or Tenancy), Sheltered Housing Officer or Tenancy Sustainment Officer so please contact them if you'd like to be considered for food or fuel vouchers.



Consider Downsizing

Are you concerned about the costs of running your home?

If you are considering moving to a smaller home then we can help you.

What is the Wise Move scheme about?

Wise Move is for Winchester City Council tenants who would like to move to a property with fewer bedrooms than their current home.

How can Wise Move help me move home?

If you are currently under occupying your home and wish to downsize to a smaller property in line with your housing need there is a financial incentive of up to £2,500.00. If you downsize but remain under occupying after your move then you will be entitled to an incentive of up to £1,000.00.

We want to make it as smooth and easy as possible for you to find a smaller home that you are happy to move to. We can help you to do this by making it financially possible and by also offering some practical support too.

The payment is available for you to take away to spend or if you ask us, we can use it to help you to arrange things like removals, furniture and carpets.

Do I qualify for Wise Move?

Any Winchester City Council tenant who wants to move to another one of our properties or a Registered Provider / Housing Association property which has fewer bedrooms can apply. If you have rent arrears, the payment may be used to help pay off your debt. The scheme is also available to Council tenants who are mutually exchanging to a property with fewer bedrooms. What are the benefits of moving to a smaller home?

Your housing needs may have changed and you could now have 'spare' bedrooms which you no longer need. Some of the benefits of moving to a smaller home include reduced bills e.g. council tax and utilities, increased eligibility benefit for working age tenants (under the Government's Size Criteria rules for 'spare' bedrooms), a home that's easier to manage and freeing up a larger home for a family that needs it

Whatever the reason for wanting a smaller property, we would like to help.

How do I apply for Wise Move?

Pride in Place

Anti-Social Behaviour Summer Campaign 2023

Neighbourhood Services and Community Safety Team launched their annual Anti-Social Behaviour Summer Campaign (engagement initiative) on 1st April 2023. This campaign is delivered in collaboration with internal services and external partners that include WCC Housing Tenancy, Hampshire and Isle Wight Constabulary, Hampshire and Isle Wight Fire and Rescue Service, Youth Outreach services, Parish Councils, Parish Community Support Officers, Education, Ward Members and Support Services.

The Anti-Social Behaviour campaign aims to undertake partnership patrols, street and block briefs, beat surgeries and walkabouts throughout the district to encourage individuals and community representatives to report their concerns via the appropriate reporting methods. As we engage with those we meet we will be encouraging discussion about all forms of anti-social behaviour such as littering, being considerate with neighbours and in open spaces. This involves reporting incidents and ways to staying safe.

Neighbourhood Services and Community Safety

Neighbourhood Services and Community Safety Team have been working in partnership with the new neighbourhood policing team dedicated to policing the centre of Winchester which was recently launched, the team, consisting of two PCs and two PCsOs, with support from a Special Constable. The new team's focus will be on reducing and preventing crime in the city centre, including issues relating to business crime, night time economy and antisocial behaviour.

Neighbourhood Services and Community Safety team have been working in partnership with the Police making sure Winchester city centre is a safer environment for people who live, work and visit here. This has included utilising the tools and powers within the Anti-social behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 working with wider partner organisations including Winchester BID and local youth services.

Tenant Satisfaction Survey 2023

Your views are really important to Winchester City Council and the survey is your chance to tell us what you think of the homes and services we provide as your landlord.

Winchester City Council is conducting the tenant satisfaction survey in 2023. This is part of the new annual Tenant Satisfaction Measures (TSM) that the Regulator of Social Housing has just introduced.

Your views are really important to Winchester City Council and the survey is your chance to tell us what you think of the homes and services we provide as your landlord.

An independent company called ARP Research have been asked to carry out the survey on our behalf. The survey is completely confidential, which means that your answers will be kept separate from your identity.

A sample of approximately a third of households in our general housing and all sheltered, extra care and temporary residents will receive a paper survey

in early May 2023, with reminders (if applicable) at the beginning of June. The final returns date is Friday 16 June. In addition, where WCC hold contact details, this group will also receive invitations/reminders to an online survey via email and text message.

Social Housing Decarbonisation Fun Wave 2 Successful Application

Winchester City Council is delighted to announce that it has been successful in its bid for support from the Government's Social Housing Decarbonisation Fund Wave 2.

The grant of £534,000, which will be match-funded by the council, will be used to improve the energy efficiency of the council's social housing properties which are currently rated D or below for their Energy Performance Certificate (EPC). This will include the installation of a range of performance improvement and energy saving measures. It will assist us in making our social housing warmer and more energy efficient, expanding the work we are already undertaking as part of our Retrofit Programme.

The funding is great news for our tenants. This will mean their homes will be warmer and cost less to heat which will help to cut energy bills. It will also cut carbon and tackle the climate emergency as our council housing becomes greener faster.

The SHDF monies will be used to help fund insulation upgrade works to the Council's Swedish units and for loft insulation upgrade works to the wider stock over the next two years.

Adaptions to Help You Live Safely In Your Home Sports

If you need to adapt your home to make it safer for you to live in your home, you can apply for an adaptation. The work will depend on your individual needs and the suitability of the property, but could range from major jobs like installing a level access shower to fitting smaller items like grab rails. Annual Gas Servicing - Keeping you Safe

It is a legal requirement for Winchester City Council to service your gas. We have set up a simple process to make sure your annual gas safety check takes place so your home is safe.

- Contractor Correct Contract Services (CCS) will send appointment letter to you for your gas service 2 months prior to the expiry date.
- If you miss your the first appointment has been missed, CCS will proceed to arrange a second appointment you.
- If CCS's engineer is still not able to again access to your home for the gas service, job will be referred back to the council.
- The council will contact the you to arrange an appointment for the gas service.
- The council will call, send text message and send email (according to the available contact method(s) on the tenancy record) to arrange an appointment with you
- If the council is unable to arrange the appointment with you by above method(s), following letters will be sent to you:
 - Gas Letter 1 Warning
 - Gas Letter 3 Access Notice
 - Gas Letter 2 Final Warning

You must allow access for the council to carry out annual servicing of gas pipe work and associated council-owned heating and/or hot water appliances. If you do not allow access, the council will be entitled to gain force entry to the property for carrying out necessary services. You will be charged for the cost of carrying out repairs and/or re-securing the property.





Shared Ownership

Winchester City Council have been selling shared ownership homes for several years now.

Shared ownership helps you get on to the property ladder whether as a first time buyer or as somebody who wants to get back into owning their own home. You'll start by buying a share of your new home and then pay affordable rent on the remaining part which is owned by us. Then, as time goes on, you can buy more shares in your home, until you own it outright. It may all sound complicated, but it's not. Winchester City Council have been helping people but their first home on a shared ownership basis for several years now and can help you get your dream home.

We'll be on hand to talk you through the buying process and ongoing responsibilities of owning a shared ownership home. Don't worry, it's all straight forward and simple to understand. Also known as 'part buy, part rent', shared ownership is backed by the government with further support from Winchester City Council.

You'll soon understand that this is a great way to become a home owner with
