

Rural England Prosperity Grants Launch of funds for 2024/2025

Round 1

- Launch week commencing Monday 6 November 2023
- Applications close 5pm Friday 5 January 2024 (nine weeks)
- 63% of 24/25 fund available for bids = £350,000 of £558,822
- capital grant applications supporting small businesses projects and community infrastructure
- The focus will be on grants between £15,000 and £25,000 with the flexibility to grant up to £50,000
- Engagement programme to include endorsements from this year's grant recipients
- Review and evaluation January 2024
- Award proposal to February Partnership Board

B Round 2

- Remaining £208,822
- Planned launch May 2024

The Nunnaminster, later known as St Mary's Abbey, was one of Winchester's three great Late Saxon royal monasteries. Interpretation panels no longer fit for purpose. Install new panels to better serve the site and also increase accessibility for wheelchair users and young people. Further supported by digital interpretation.
