Meeting Minutes

Welcome and introductions	LT	
LT asked for any declarations of interest, and it was confirmed that Hampshire Cultural		
Trust and WinAcc are recipients of grant funding.		
LT reported on the actions taken since last meeting:		
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 WCC to investigate coft-effectiveness of Twyford Parish Council EV chargers. Resolution: This application has since been withdrawn. 		
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 WCC to check environment agency permit for Itchen Abbas and Avington Village Hall's ground source heat pump. Resolution: Permit not required 		
WCC will obtain further information on biodiversity / native species regarding		
Central Winchester Regeneration (CWR). Resolution: this is being considered		
as part of the project application.		
Board members to receive application summaries and board papers to review		
ahead of future meetings. Resolution : papers sent out ahead of meeting.

AW outlined the launch of Rural England Prosperity Fund for 2024/2025:	All	
Round 1 (£350,000 of £558,822) application period open 6 November 2023 and		
close 5 January 2024. Scored applications will be bought to February		
Partnership Board for comment		
Round 2 (remaining 208,822) applications open May 2024.		
AW opened the table for discussion on how to best launch REPF funding. The board		
suggested:		
large-scale outreach through organisations' mailing lists		
targeting WeCAN community groups and WGW network		
approaching unsuccessful applicants for HCC grants		
 providing more support and information for smaller, rural organisations 		
 ensuring all underspend is allocated per government interventions 		
 providing assistance regarding cultural interventions (i.e., how to deliver cultural 		
outcomes through capital spending)		
ACTION: Board members to promote the launch of Rural England Prosperity Fund for 2024/2025 to mailing lists and interested parties.		
ACTION: WCC to ensure communication and language in funding specifications is		
clear, relevant, and inclusive. Resolution: Actioned with communications team and		
ongoing for next round of funding.		
AW also wanted to bring attention to upcoming grants within economy and community		
departments for green initiatives / net-zero targets.		
ACTION: WCC to confirm match funding percentages for business grants.		
Resolution: For the green business grants businesses are required to provide 50%		
match funding. For further information about the grant criteria visit:

AG explained that £80,000 remains available to fund 2024/25 UK Shared Prosperity		
projects, made up from the allocation to parish projects and the withdrawal of Wickham Square project. Feedback on priority areas/themes was sought and included:		
 intelligence from residents or visitors as to what they would like to see WeCan groups will be a good point of contact as they are likely to have pipeline 		
projects ready for funding		
 wildflower/pollinator planting in places of non-diverse/neglected space 		
emphasising not just physical space but also social projects		
WCC neighbourhood teams could advise and help us explore the safety and		
inclusivity of our streets which could inform potential projects		
 Local Nature Recovery Strategy will highlight opportunities in the district 		
 picking up existing projects where funding has been cut 		
 build an extending reach an existing activity into the district 	1

Information and updates AG **UK Shared Prosperity Fund** AG introduced the 2023/2024 UKSPF project status update: 10 projects 7 underway 1 contract signing 2 reassigned Due to a £17,600 underspend, there was an additional project call to applicants of which two met all requirements. See slides for further information. SR thanked the board for their comments. ACTION: The Board requested to be informed of any future underspends requiring additional project calls. **Rural England Prosperity Fund** AG introduced the 2023/2024 REPF project status update: 10 projects 4 underway 4 pending 1 withdrawn £12,000 had become available for reallocation, pending confirmation of four projects. AG confirmed that there is a small amount of flexibility from government to carry-over money to next year, supported by a project plan AG 3. Government reporting AG informed the board that government reporting is due on 1 November 2023 for any outputs and outcomes from money spend between 1 April to 30 September. WCC feltconfident that this would be achieved and reported in good time. 4. Next meeting SR Friday 9 February 2024 - 9:30am to 11:30am LT 5. Summing up AG confirmed that due diligence will be undertaken by the financial team. The formal risk register will be updated upon further application decisions.
