VISION: WINCHESTER COMMUNITY SAFETY PARTNERSHIP

Winchester Community Safety Partnership remains committed to reducing crime and disorder across the district. By working in partnership with both statutory and non-statutory organisations we will focus on those offenders who have an impact on individuals and society and provide support to those who are vulnerable in our communities.

MISSION:

To increase feelings of safety and reduce the incidence of crime and disorder.

GOVERNANCE:

Winchester Community Safety Partnership undertakes a collaborative approach to the delivery of the priority themes via a Strategic management group. They oversee the implementation of statutory duty, work together to deliver partnership activity and monitor performance.

PARTNERSHIP:

Operational delivery is undertaken in collaboration with responsible authorities in conjunction with the third sector and the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner. The responsible authorities are:

- Hampshire County Council (Youth Justice)
- Winchester City Council
- Hampshire & Isle of Wight Constabulary
- Hampshire & Isle of Wight Fire & Rescue Service
- Integrated Care Board
- Ministry of Justice Probation Service

PARTNERSHIP PRIORITIES 2024/2025

1. DOMESTIC ABUSE

- Reduce the risks around Domestic Homicide by developing partnership plans that respond to serious case review recommendations.
- Understand the reasons behind current trend increases in relation to the under 25 age group and repeat victims.
- Deliver against the Government Legislation aimed at tackling domestic abuse (Domestic Abuse Act 2021).
- Promote commissioned domestic abuse services aimed at increasing the domestic abuse and violence reports requesting support.

2. PRIORITY CRIME

- Deliver against the Partnership Safer Streets 5, Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG) strategy.
- Increase the Formal Action Taken (FAT) outcomes in drug related crime.
- Deliver partnership focused activity against the Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Act 2022 (tackling serious violence).
- Prioritise Violence, drug and sexual offences as a crime focus for the partnership.
- Undertake a scoping exercise to ascertain levels of stalking across the district.

3. QUALITY OF LIFE

- Promote access to new crisis services.
- Undertake a targeted approach to tackling ASB.
- Put in place additional partnership hotspot patrols in response to the ASB data.
- Implement targeted partnership operations in response to begging, shoplifting and ASB.
- Put in place the intervention, diversion and support for those young people coming to partners attention because of their ASB.
- Develop an ASB Summer Campaign of partnership patrols, education and enforcement.
