## Response

- Q1: This information is not held by the Council for the purposes of FOI but please see response to Q2 for further context.
- Q2: Yes. A contract which is tendered based on most advantageous tender, a minimum of 10% to environmental and or social matters will be included in the evaluation criteria.
- Q3. Yes. As per the response to Q2, if tenders are to be evaluated based on most advantageous tender, environmental and or social matters are a consideration. The information requested to demonstrate this is tailored to each opportunity to ensure its relevant and proportionate to the contract requirements and it is not a barrier to SME's.
- Q4: Please see response to Q3, we have no fixed timeframe as we do not adopt a blanket approach when conducting procurement activities.
- Q5: The inclusion of a suitable accreditation or equivalent in a tender evaluation criteria are usually scored on a pass/ fail basis, and we are confident using this scoring mechanism.
