

**Notice of Making of Various Road Traffic Regulation Orders
Affecting the District of Winchester City Council**

On 9th April 2014 Winchester City Council as agents for Hampshire County Council made the undermentioned road traffic regulation orders:-

1. The Hampshire (Various Roads, Highcliffe, Winchester)(20 Miles per Hour Speed Limit) Order 2013

The effect of this order, proposals for which were advertised on 16th October 2013 will be to introduce a 20 mile per hour speed limit in various roads in Highcliffe, Winchester. Details are as follows:-

Road Name	Parish	Traffic Restrictions Proposed
For the entirety of the road: Canute Road, Cathedral View, Chalk Ridge, Chesil Wood, Dell Road, East Hill, Fivefields Close, Fivefields Road, Gordon Avenue, Highcliffe Road, Milland Road, Nelson Road, Petersfield Road, Portal Road, St Catherine's Road, St Giles Close, St Leonard's Road, Vale Road Quarry Road: from its junction with East Hill to its junction with Stratton Road.	St John & All Saints	20 miles per hour speed limit

2. The Hampshire (Various Roads, Winnall, Winchester)(20 Miles per Hour Speed Limit) Order 2013

The effect of this order, proposals for which were advertised on 16th October 2013 will be to introduce a 20 mile per hour speed limit in various roads in Winnall, Winchester. Details are as follows:-

Road Name	Parish	Traffic Restrictions Proposed
For the entirety of the road: Baigent Close, Ebden Road, Firmstone Road, Furley Close, Garbett Road, Gatekeeper Close, Imber Road, Limetree Walk, Longfield Road, Longhouse Green, Manor Close, Moss Road, Peacock Place, Ringlet Way, Roundhuts Rise, Shepherds Road, Spitfire End, Turnpike Down, Warren Road; Winnall Manor Road from its junction with Winnall Valley Road to a point 21.6 metres north of its junction with Alresford Road.	St John & All Saints	20 miles per hour speed limit

Each of the above orders will come into operation on 21st April 2014
Copies of the orders, maps showing the locations and a statement of reasons for each of the above orders and the orders to be varied may be inspected during usual office hours at the City Offices, Colebrook Street, Winchester.
Any person who wishes to question the validity of any of the above orders or any of the provisions of the orders on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with may, within six weeks of the date when the orders were made apply to the High Court for that purpose.
